Right after the Delhi Government lifted Covid19 restrictions, we immediately resumed our CHEP(Child Health Education Program) program, and most of our kids came to our Centre which was an exciting moment for all of us. But, we had a new challenge dealing with the kids whose focus and interest was more towards Cocurricular activities and not on academic studies, also most of our volunteers were out of station as they left for home during Covid19 and haven't returned. Few volunteers came on March 2022 but left after two months as they had completed their graduation exam. Despite all this our faithful volunteers namely Sophia, Purnima, Saranjit, Monica, PayPal, Vansika, Kshitiz, Manish, Kriti, and Akash, have been helping us regularly both offline and online.

Focal Point, Medical Camp and COC (Chat-Over-Coffee) was not conducted regularly as before due to Covid19. We could have COC with our volunteer through online zoom meeting on few occasions. We are planning to have Medical Camp end of this year on October 2022.

This year we were able to distribute around three hundred (350) blankets in Old Delhi, Iharodha and Badabagh areas of Delhi. We are happy to share that Institute of Social Service. Prabhatara Hostel has donated two hundred blankets to us. We gave the Blankets to those living in the streets and sleep by the roadside. Most of the people we met were not able to find a place to stay in the shelter provided by the Government due to lack of identity





The cold winter night in Delhi is harsh and challenging for the homeless people living in the streets of the city. Every year PMI has been distributing Blankets to the needy during winter nights in and around Delhi. The blanket drive program for this year was held in December end and one in January 2022. Unlike the previous years we have to distribute at early morning from 4:30 am and in the day time due to Covid19 curfew restrictions at night in the city.

We are glad that we could help those in need. At the same time, we are thankful to all the volunteers who came to help us from different parts of Delhi and Gurugram. Volunteers are the backbone of our NGO.

Currently we are supporting 120 more such students with an aim to create a similar impact. This was all possible with the help of more than 1000 volunteers and 50+ interns who have mentored and tutored these children regularly in the past.

For this we regularly organize career counselling sessions to understand their ambition, focal points to discuss life issues and mentorship forums to provide guidance.
